

# HATE IN FAMILY RELATIONSHIPS: THE PERMANENCE OF AN INFANTICIDE SHADOW IN FREUDIAN CULTURE

**Rezumat:** *The German story “Struwwelpeter” (Shockheaded Peter or Slovenly Peter), remarked and appreciated by S. Freud, was created by a pediatrician, Heinrich Hoffmann. This story refers to the phantasms associated with the relationships between parents and children in all ten illustrated storiottes that it consists of. We will study these three stories that have as a common point the presence of an infanticidal desire, the expression of a primary phantasm regarding the parricidal phantasm. We also find this problematic in the clinical study of a case that stages the paternity stakes at child birth, more precisely the context of father-son relationship.*
